Ideally located on Lake Orr, the ASPIRE Rowing Program provides students the opportunity to involved in a sport otherwise not accessible to other schools along with a pathway to Olympic dreams.

Goals and Purpose

The ASPIRE Rowing program aims to provide students an unparalleled opportunity to develop towards 'elite' levels in Rowing, through elite coaching opportunities and specialised strength and conditioning. Program Overview

The ASPIRE Rowing program is conducted as an extra-curricular activity to allow students to access all academic opportunities available at the college, whist still providing students the opportunity to develop their sporting ability.

The below training schedule is an example only. Training days and times will be communicated by the coach prior to the season starting.

Junior Secondary 'Learn to Row' Program on land and water training times:

- Tuesday 2:45pm 4.45pm
- Thursday 2:45pm 4.45pm

Senior Secondary on land and water training times:

- Monday 5.30am-7:30am
- Wednesday 5.30am-7.30am
- Friday 5.30am-7.30am

Students MUST be on time and ready to train as per the program training times set out above. If a student is unable to take part for any reason they are to notify the Head Coach via email, phone or in person.



Competitions & Tournaments

The ASPIRE Rowing program takes part in several weekend based Regattas throughout the school calendar year providing our program students with a great opportunity to represent the Varsity Vikings, work as a team and enjoy the sport of rowing at a competitive level. The regattas start with the Gold Coast Regional All Schools Rowing Association Regattas and then flow on to higher competitive levels, such as:

- South Queensland Championships, Wyaralong Dam
- GCR Inter-Regional Selection Time Trials, Wyaralong Dam
- Queensland School State Championships, Rockhampton

Partnerships and Industry Links

Varsity College ASPIRE Rowing is a proud partner with Griffith University Rowing. The partnership provides opportunities for athletes to access State and National pathways in Term 4 only each year. In Term 1, 2 and 3 it is school season and Varsity College students will not be permitted to row or compete with any other rowing institution.

Student Selection Criteria

At the start of each school year, an invitation will be forwarded out to all Varsity College students from years 6-10 to come and experience the great sport of rowing through our Rowing Open House. There is no pre-requisite of rowing experience required, but more of an opportunity for new students to learn about the sport of rowing on the land and in the water. From the 'Open House' a "Learn to Row' program will be established for those new to the sport while talent identified athletes with rowing experience will also be provided to join our ASPIRE Sport Rowing Excellence Program.

Successful applicants for the ASPIRE Rowing Excellence program will need to demonstrate (and provide supporting documentation for):

- Complete and submit the ASPIRE Rowing Expression of Interest Form
- Above average academic results in all subjects
- Very high levels of behaviour and effort
- High levels of physical fitness displayed at the ASPIRE Rowing Open House
- A clear desire for extending their skills within their chosen sport and contributing to the broader sport community of the college.

Upon completion of an interview process, staff and specialist teachers will decide on the suitability of each applicant. Successful applicants will be notified by the school.



Expectations and Commitment to Program Requirements

The ASPIRE Program is committed to providing and maintaining a high performing and supportive learning environment for all its students. Being a part of the ASPIRE Program is a privilege, and students involved in the program must value and respect their placement. To this end, ASPIRE Students will endeavour to perform at the highest level across the Global ASPIRE Performance Areas:

- Submit all assessment complete and by the due date.

- Be punctual and prepared for all lessons.
- Display high levels of behaviour at all times, not only during ASPIRE lessons, but with all Varsity College staff (teaching and non-teaching), contract and supply teachers.

Culture

- Students understand they bear responsibility as an ambassador of the ASPIRE Program to be seen as a positive role model to others within the local community
- Maintain a high level of school attendance in order to maintain learning standards.
- Active participation in competitions, events, activities and excursions related to the ASPIRE Program.
- Maintain high uniform standards in line with the Varsity College Appearance Policy.
- Be accepting and tolerant of all students.
- Show modesty and humility in interacting with students.

Application Process

The Varsity College ASPIRE Program applicants are required to:

• Complete the online ASPIRE Program Application which can be found on the Varsity College website. Upload all required documentation as required and submit by the closing date.

Please note that incomplete applications will not be accepted.

- All Applications must be received no later than 27th March 2023
- You will receive further correspondence about testing dates and times once your application has been received and processed.

Upon completion of the application process, staff and specialist teachers will decide on the suitability of each applicant. Successful applicants will be notified by the school and the **school's decision will be final**.
